- UP indicates the use of unfair practice in the assessment of the module, a mark of 0 is attributed to the module
- AB indicates absence from the module
- NC indicates non-completion of the module
- W indicates withdrawal from the course
- * Compensation: Schemes of assessment for final degree class based on an aggregate may discount any extra marks obtained under rules of compensation
- ** Qualified Fail: Failure to pass each element of assessment results in the overall failure of the module
