Bridge squeezes complete, Clyde Love, Exercise 1



East plays the Jack on the $9 \bigstar$ lead and we have 12 top tricks.

There is only one possibility (other than a mis defense) for the 13th trick - that the person with $4+ \mathbf{v}$'s also holds KQJ of spades.

First in your own mind picture the key position you want ot get to - see diagram right which shows the position with the squeeze trick about to be played.

Once you have a picture in your mind of the key position simply cash one heart, the clubs & all the diamonds to get to that position with the lead in the correct hand and East has nowhere to go.



When the last diamond is cashed with the A threat being in the South hand North is free to keep all the hearts but East has to make a fatal discard.

Note that if North had the 10 then this would not work against East who can see Norths discard and can throw the same suit.

It would work against West however as West has to discard first & North keeps whatever West unguards.
